Girl Scout Bronze Award Information Sheet

Read this page before you start working on your Bronze Award!

The Girl Scout Bronze Award is the highest honor a registered Girl Scout Junior may receive. It shows you have made a promise to help others, improve your community and world, and become the best that you can be. (See pages 202-203 in your Junior Girl Scout handbook.)

The Girl Scout Bronze Award recognizes your efforts in a wide range of Girl Scout experiences and shows that you understand and live by the Girl Scout Promise and Law. There are four requirements for this award. You should work closely with your troop leader/advisor in the completion of all the requirements. The first three requirements call upon you to learn skills, increase your leadership skills and make a commitment to improve your Girl Scout Junior experiences.

Requirements two thru four may be done in any order, but you must attend the council Bronze Award workshop first and complete the fifth requirement (the Girl Scout Bronze Award Project) last. Requirements begun prior to being a registered Girl Scout Junior may not be applied to this award.

- 1) Attend the council's Bronze Award Workshop
- 2) Complete two badges that are related to your project.
- 3) Complete one of the Girl Scout Signs.
- 4) Earn the Junior Aide Award, or the Junior Girl Scout Leadership Award or any one of the following two badges: Girl Scouting in the U.S.A., Girl Scouting Around the World, Girl Scouting in my Future, or Lead On
- 5) Plan and complete a Girl Scout Bronze Award Project.

The Girl Scout Bronze Award Project has five steps. Your project, including planning and execution, should take a minimum of fifteen hours. The actual implementation of the project should take *seven to eight hours*.

Attendance of the council Bronze Award workshop by you and your leader (or parent if you are a Juliette) is required before starting any of the steps. The Bronze Award workshops are offered by the council in the spring and fall. The workshop will go through the steps to earn your award and you will learn about what the difference is between a community service project and a Girl Scout Bronze Award project.

When your project is finished submit the completed Girl Scout Bronze Award Report form to the Younger Girl Program Coordinator. To help in recognizing you in our council publications and your local newspapers, please include any pictures you've taken while completing your project with a brief description. Once you turn in your completed report the Younger Girl Program Coordinator will contact you within two weeks and send a voucher for you to purchase the award in the council shop. You should plan to turn your paperwork in at least a month in advance of a planned award ceremony in case of unforeseen circumstances that result in the award not being available when you go to the council shop.

You must submit the required paperwork and turn them into the Younger Girl Program Coordinator before any council recognition will be made in local newspapers or council publications.
