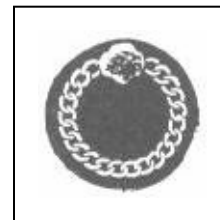


Girl Scouts of the U.S.A.—Service Unit/Program Delivery Level Recognition

(Does not require Board approval. May be approved at unit level.)

Outstanding Volunteer Award



The Outstanding Volunteer Award recognizes an adult in a position other than leader or in addition to leader whose service benefits a service unit or program delivery group that is beyond the expectations of the position

Criteria

1. The candidate is a registered Girl Scout adult.
2. The candidate has completed appropriate training, or demonstrated competence for the position, or both.
3. The candidate has performed at a level that exceeds the expectations of the position as outlined in the position description.

Nomination: An individual or group familiar with the candidate's performance submits a nomination form or narrative account of the candidate's accomplishments to the Service Unit or Program Delivery Recognition Team or to the Council Adult Recognition Task Group.

Approval: The Service Unit or Program Delivery Recognition Team or the Council Adult Recognition Task Group reviews the information, approves or denies the nomination, and notifies the nominating individual or group.

Form of Recognition: The Outstanding Volunteer Award is a pin depicting a white chain and gold trefoil against a red background. It is worn on the right side of the uniform, below the personalized

identification pin, or on either side of the Years of Service pin.

The award should be presented in the awardee's community at an appropriate activity with local publicity.

Candidates for the Outstanding Volunteer Award could be, but are not limited to the following:

- ❑ A recruiter who has retained or increased adult or girl membership beyond the goals set.
- ❑ A consultant who consistently provides high quality contemporary issues programs to girls.
- ❑ A person who has significantly increased Girl Scouting's positive image within a community through a variety of methods and media.
- ❑ An event director who has managed several successful events with increased use of girl involvement.
- ❑ A unit annual giving captain or troop enroller who has increased support from the local community and families and who gives a significant donation.
- ❑ A delegate who successfully uses the democratic process to solicit members' opinions and has generated enthusiasm for involvement in the business of the Council.

Note: *The Outstanding Volunteer Award differs significantly from the Appreciation Pin only in the level of approval required. This encourages increased recognition of volunteers at the service unit/program delivery level.*
